

Check Belt Tightness Hold at the Forward-Facing Belt Path.

Push and pull from side to side.

It should not move more than **1 in.** (2.5 cm).

Car Seat Use Requirements

Measure your child's weight and height (do not guess) before choosing the car seat's mode.

This Quick Start Guide is set up to help you get started installing either the 1st or 2nd mode: **Rear-Facing** or **Forward-Facing**.

For **Booster Seat** mode and other information about choosing car seat modes, please read the full instruction manual.



REAR-FACING MODE

4-40 lb (1.8-18 kg) **and 19-40 in.** (48-101.6 cm)

Children under 1 year of age must ride Rear-Facing.

In this car seat, your child can remain Rear-Facing until they outgrow any one of the following:

- Weight Limit: 40 lb (18 kg); OR
- Height Limit: 40 in. (101.6 cm); **OR**
- **Rear-Facing** child fit requirements. See page 11 of manual.



FORWARD-FACING MODE

22-65 lb (10.1-29 kg)

and 29-49 in. (73.6-125 cm)


Children must be at least 1 year of age to ride **Forward-Facing.**

In this car seat, your child can remain harnessed Forward-Facing until they outgrow any one of the following:

- Weight Limit: 65 lb (29 kg); OR
- Height Limit: 49 in. (125 cm); **OR**
- Forward-Facing child fit requirements. See page 12 of manual.

Rear-Facing Vehicle Install

There are 2 methods for install. Choose only one:







LATCH: Lower Anchor Belt

Do not use both the LATCH: lower anchor belt and vehicle belt at the same time. When used correctly, the LATCH: lower anchor belt or vehicle belts are equally safe.

OR



Place Car Seat Rear-Facing in Back Seat



Never install a rear-facing child restraint in the front seat of a vehicle equipped with an active frontal airbag.




Fully Recline Car Seat

Recline handle on front of seat and under pad.

Check Rear-Facing Level Line

For children who cannot sit up unassisted, the level line must be parallel with the ground.

For children who can sit up unassisted, you may rotate the child restraint to be more upright in Position 2.








Determine what kind of vehicle belt you have and how to lock a child restraint in place.


OR

Determine where designated LATCH: lower anchor seating positions are located in your vehicle.









Check Belt Tightness


Hold at the **Rear-Facing Belt Path**.

Push and pull from side to side.

It should not move more than **1 in.** (2.5 cm).

Recheck Rear-Facing Level Line

Redo the installation if the car seat is not reclined correctly for your child.



Finished! Check the tightness of the install often.





7 Forward-Facing Vehicle Install

There are 2 methods for install. Choose only one:








LATCH: Lower Anchor Belt + Tether up to 40 lb (18 kg)

Do not use both the LATCH: lower anchor belt and vehicle belt at the same time. When used correctly, the LATCH: lower anchor belt or vehicle belts are equally safe.



Place Car Seat Forward-Facing in Back Seat


Put the child restraint into Position 1.

Vehicle seat back must be upright.



If your vehicle has a headrest that interferes with a flush car seat fit, check your vehicle owner's manual to see if it can be removed, adjusted, or if there are other possible seating locations for you to install.
